  - 5. School Leader Report: Ms. T.
    - Student especially 5th and 6th graders are being effected by the violence in MPLS. Staff taking extra care of scholars during these troubling times. The school is looking into different crowdfunding options to help support scholars and students.
    - The student that was burned will have to have surgery.
    - Abused student was taken from safe family home and place back with abusive family in a different state.
    - NWEA scores Growth in reading from Fall to Winter for all grades except 5th & 6th grade.
    - Most grades are close if not above the national average in reading and

math.

- Crown commented that the scores look great.
- Growth in math score from fall to winter except for 5th grade.
- Mrs. T explains how the scores from 5th grader usually dip because of the introduction to new material and a hard course load from 4th to 5th grade. She explain that this is normal for this time period in a scholars school journey.
- K- 2 grade scores were unavailable at the time of the meeting because they had test that day and scores take up to 24 hrs to post.
- New tutoring program is going well, the biggest issue is getting students home after because it is an afterschool program. Mrs. T proposed buying a 26 passenger bus to aid in the drop off of scholars from afterschool programs.
- Emily thanks Mrs. T for clear data with the test scores.
- Emily expresses concern about the 5th graders test scores in reading and math.
- Mrs. T states that this is normal for 5th graders. She also informs the board that most of the scholars being effected by the violence in MPLS are the 5th graders. She expressed that the staff is giving the scholars grace because they understand how hard it is to focus at school when you home life is falling apart.
- Emily praised Mrs. T for her efforts to support the scholars through it all.
- Emily congratulated Mrs. T for her transparency about the scholars and the test scores.
- Emily also commented that she was worried about the expenses for a new bus.
- Ms. Jackie commented about how great the test score were with the scholars coming out of holiday break and social distance learning.
- Mrs. T explains how most of the 2000 books have been given away to scholars. The books are helping the scholars improve and excel.
- An inspection of the air quality in the building resulted in good scores. The staff will continue to do what they have been doing ensure safe work environment for staff and scholars.
- There was a COVID scare for the 2nd graders the week before. Staff tested all 2nd graders.
- School currently has 4 COVID testing machines.
- Ms. T presented us with the new school dog. Midnight Luna. Training the dog to be emotional support dog for students and staff.
